"Langaa" means "desire," and in the case of Langaa Publishing, a "desire for knowledge." They have published almost 500 books, now available in libraries and personal collections throughout the world, thanks to hundreds of authors, an international network of volunteers, print-on-demand technology, and a partnership with African Books Collective. Toure will review some of the publications – ranging from the #RhodesMustFall movement in South Africa to the current unrest in Cameroon, as well as some of the highlights and challenges in publishing the stories of ordinary and extraordinary Africans.
